## **COVID-19 INFO:**

- We have created a place for feedback from families on our current COVID policies and protocols. <u>Click here</u> to write in any feedback, suggestions, resources, and thoughts you may have. We will be checking these responses periodically, and as we consider changes and amendments to our COVID policies.
- Masks are not required inside for adults, but still encouraged. Disposable masks are available in the Tree House.
- There are sanitization stations at each entrance with hand sanitizer and a bottle of disinfectant. Every person must wash or sanitize their hands upon entering the building.
- Temperature checks are completed upon arrival for any person entering the building. Currently our temperature cut off is 100.4°. Any child being sent home for illness can return after 24 hours (symptom free).
- A negative COVID test will be required to return if COVID symptoms are presented
- Quarantine Guidelines for Exposure:
  - o Unvaccinated individuals:
    - If someone has an exposure to a positive case of COVID-19, the exposed individual will have two options for quarantining:
      - The first option is to quarantine for 7 days then, if symptom free the entire time, they can test on or after the 7<sup>th</sup> day (PCR or Antigen). If the test is negative the individual can return to school that day.
      - Alternatively, the individual can forgo testing and quarantine for a full 10 days.
    - If the test is positive, or an individual begins showing symptoms, they will need to quarantine for 10 days from the positive test or the first sign of symptoms.

#### Vaccinated individuals:

Individuals who are fully vaccinated (with appropriate boosters) do NOT need to quarantine after contact with someone who had COVID-19 unless they have <a href="mailto:symptoms">symptoms</a>. However, fully vaccinated people should get tested 3-5 days after their exposure, even if they don't have symptoms and wear a mask indoors in public for 10 days following exposure or until their test result is negative."
